

















- Project objectives
- Reinforcing the cooperation and joint implementation between Belgian competent authorities, river basin managers and stakeholders
- Implementing best-practice, demonstration and pilot projects to facilitate the implementation of the RBMP
- Creating a support base by monitoring project outcomes, knowledge dissemination & awareness raising





- Reinforcing the cooperation and joint implementation between Belgian competent authorities, river basin managers and stakeholders
- For the project area, covering 3 Belgian regions, a stronger cooperation between competent authorities and water managers is necessary for a better implementation of the WFD
 - On the interregional level, initiatives will be set up to boost the cooperation between regional competent authorities to tackle shared challenges for implementation
 - On the local level, consultation groups including water managers and local stakeholders will be established
- The capacity and mechanisms developed will be transferred to the entire Scheldt IRBD, so that for the 3rd RBMPs a harmonised approach for the analysis of the main problems and for the selection of measures can be worked out and applied





- Implementing best-practice, demonstration and pilot projects to facilitate the implementation of the RBMP
- Implementation of concrete projects in rural and highly urbanized areas to
 - ..realize an actual on-the-ground effect
 - ..demonstrate that a project area can be restored towards an effective riverine ecosystem
- 3 clusters of implementation actions
 - Actions diminishing pollution and improve quality of rivers
 - Actions enhancing hydro-morphological quality & continuity
 - Actions restoring natural water retention capacity






- Creating a support base by monitoring project outcomes, knowledge dissemination & awareness raising
- Setup and manage shared monitoring schemes to allow evaluation of project results and progress made in the implementation of the WFD
- Pay specific attention to knowledge dissemination and capacity building, not only aimed at public sector organisations but also at stakeholders
- Facilitate public interaction for an increased acceptance and understanding of WFD/FD actions







Expected results

- The IP will contribute to a more extensive, more targeted and better coordinated implementation of the WFD of the Flemish, Brussels and Walloon region, particularly for the selected catchment areas
- The IP-actions tackle a wide range of pressures and will hence bring about significant progress towards the WFD good status.
- Since most of the actions are selected on the basis of their multi-functionality, the IP will also contribute to a better quantitative water management in these catchment areas and hence reduce flood risks.
- Long term implementation of the RBMPs/FRMPs within the 3 Belgian regions is guaranteed
 - The 2nd RBMPs (1st FRMPs) will be implemented in the timeframe 2016-2021
 - The 3rd RBMPs (2nd FRMPs) are due by 2021 and will be implemented in the timeframe 2022-2027

Setting up a LIFE Integrated Project





- Why LIFE IP?
- Not every project idea will fit LIFE (IP) criteria
 - Need for an adopted plan or strategy as a starting point
 - Get to know your good and bad points from an EU perspective
 - → Get in touch with your national LIFE contact points
- When to start?



- Assessing your organization
- Capability
 - → Legal commitment
 - → Financial commitment
- Competence
 - → Back-up to carry out the project
 - → Resources to finance the project



- Assessing your capacity
- Practical
 - Time available for preparation + management
 - → Languages
- Intellectual
 - → Posses knowledge on project theme & objectives
 - → Implementation, but also reporting (com, fin)
- Social
 - → Talking, traveling, planning, changing,...



- Organising yourself
- Call for support
 - → From the beginning
 - → For specific tasks
- Different roles in a project
 - → **Project manager** has end responsibility
 - → **Project coordinator** for daily management
 - → Financial manager helping with figures & reporting
 - → Communication manager is your link to the public
 - → Others: project engineer, lawyer, secretary,...



Setting up a LIFE Integrated Project Who to involve?

- Participating in an EU project
- Lead beneficiary: extra responsibility
- (Associated) beneficiary
- Financer: not part of the project
- Subcontractor: not part of the project
- IMPORTANT: expenses related to transactions between organisations in the same partnership are considered ineligible for (co-)funding

- Idea > EU project
- Aim | What do I want to achieve?
- Objectives | Which elements help achieving my aim?
- Actions | Individual activities & investments



- ▶ Idea > EU project
- Aim | What do I want to achieve?
 - → I want people to cycle more in my city
- Objectives | Which elements help achieving my aim?
 - → (1) Better understanding, (2) Better infrastructure, (3) Raised awareness
- Actions | Individual activities & investments
 - → WP1A1 Assessing quality of infrastructure, WP1A2 Survey why people not cycling, ..., WP2A2 Construction of missing link in network, ...



- Split your actions in different categories
- Preparatory actions
- Implementation actions
- Monitoring actions
- Communication actions
- Project management actions



- Some actions are obligatory...
- Monitoring the (socio-economic) impact of your project
- Communicating through a project webpage
- LIFE notice boards
- After-LIFE communication plan
- ..or recommended
- Cooperation with other projects
- Communicating through social media



- Complementary actions
- What are complementary actions?
- How important are complementary actions?
- How many complementary actions should be included in the proposal?
- Should complementary actions always be supported by other EU funds?



Setting up a LIFE Integrated Project Writing your application

- Picking the right words
- Take into account objectives funding programme
 - They're not there to fund your objectives, but their own
- Level of detail
 - → Evaluators not necessarily familiar with project theme
 - → Measurable results
 - → Value for money



Setting up a LIFE Integrated Project Budgeting your application

- Where to find the resources
- ▶ LIFE programme
- Own contribution
 - → Own resources or co-financed
 - → But no co-financing through other EU-programmes
